



Ukrainian-Slovak serial UNESCO World Natural Heritage Property «Primeval Beech Forests of the Carpathians»

Covers the surface of 29278,9 ha (48692,69 ha – buffer zone) and is composed of 10 clusters, 6 of which are located in Ukraine and 4 – in Slovak Republic.

The Ukrainian part of made up of CBR massifs (5 of the clusters) with total surface 20980,5 ha, and 1 cluster 2532,0 ha

BEECH PRIMEVAL FORESTS OF THE CARPATHIANS









Area: 58.035,8 ha, 39.485,8 ha of which are directly managed by CBR, and 18.550 ha are managed by other landusers


Territorial structure: 9 isolated massifs

Location: southern macroslope of the main Ukrainian Carpathians watershed

Functional zoning:

Core area (A) – 29,6 %; Buffer zone (B) – 29,7 %; Traditional nature use (C) – 35,1 %; Regulated protection – 5,6 %

Staff: 272 employees: 122 rangers, 25 scientists, 11 specialists on ecological education, 5 specialists on ecotourism and recreation, the rest are working for subsidiary services





BIODIVERSITY

Flora: 3029 species (1359 high vascular plant species), 183 of which are rare and listed to the Red Book of Ukraine, and 42 of them – to the international conservation lists

Fauna: 4813 species (306 vertebrate species), 232 of which are rare ones listed to the Red Book of Ukraine and to the international conservation lists, including 5 strictly endemic species of invertebrates known only from CBR

Vegetation: around 400 vegetation associations, 102 of which are listed to the Green Book of Ukraine

Endangered habitat types: 23







OTHER NATURAL VALUES:

- European biggest primeval forests: beech, mixed and spruce;
- Practically undisturbed alpine landscapes of the Ukrainian Carpathians – subalpine and alpine meadows, crooked woodland;
- Significant viable populations of large carnivores (lynx, wolf, brown bear);
- Ukrainian greatest bats colonies;
- Highland lakes with unique biota;
- Crystal clear mountain streams with water that could serve as a reference model;
- Largest lowland population of a montane narcissus species Narcissus angustifolium;
- Karst limestone caves with endemic troglobiont species;
- Limestone cliffs with rare calcifilous flora











SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

Chronicles of nature is the basic scientific topic for reserves and nature parks of Ukraine, as well as the main form of generalization of research outcomes. This is actually the program of overall ecological monitoring.

CBR has a significant scientific basis: 47 scientific plots, 22 phenological plot, 46 phenological trails, 7 weather stations, 6 hydrological stations, a network of inventory plots and trails

An important element of CBR's scientific activity is organizing international conferences and workshops, and participation in international projects. 17 scientific forums of this kind were organized and held by CBR within the last 20 years, 14 of which were international events; dozen of scientific and conservation international projects were implemented by the reserve.

SUPPORTING THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

There are 20 settlements within CBR scope with over 100 000 residents. The reserve's administration has established good cooperation with them.

Around 10 000 of sheep and 1500 cows are pastured at CBR annually. It is an important component of local economy.

People dwelling at the border with the reserve are supplied with firewood, hayfields, are permitted to gather barriers and mushrooms.









CBR promotes the cultural heritage in particular through support to numerous ethnic festivals





The Decree of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine "About the state support of the complex ecological, economical and social development of Rakhiv district" was elaborated and lobbied by CBR. This document is aimed at providing the economical development in the region based in particular on elimination of negative pressure on the environment, interdiction of renewable and nature friendly technologies and balanced use of local natural resources (forest, water, land etc.).
