
Geografical locations

- The National Park Djerdap is situated in the South-East of Europe, in the North-East of the Republic of Serbia, along the international border with Romania. Total surface of the National Park is 63.608 ha, and the protective area surrounding the Park has surface of 93.968 ha.
- The Park stretches along the right bank of Danube, for about 100 km, covering a narrow strip of forested hills, which is 2-8 km wide, in altitude range from 50 to 800 meters.
- Its most characteristic feature are forests (covering more that 64% of total surface) and exceptional wealth and diversity of flora, fauna, geomorphologic objects and cultural monuments from various historical periods.)













Djerdap is the cradle of European civilization... (proto script of Lepenski vir, the oldest known urban settlement in Europe, the first examples of monumental culture, solar calendar... 8000 years ago...)










Organizational informations
