- Since November 2009 support by EURAC expert team







- Renewed mandate COP3 decision 3/2 on spatial development
- Adoption of the Strategic Action Plan for the Carpathian Area

Recent developments:

- Consultative Workshop 'Moving towards a Carpathian Strategy' 25 January 2011, Brussels
- Carpathians integrated in the EU Strategy for the Danube Region and the accompanying Action Plan
- BIOREGIO Carpathians as one flagship project within the EUSDR
- EC Calls for Tenders:
 Preparatory action on climate in the Carpathian region
- EU DG Regio represented at COP3
- Europe of the Carpathians Conference, part of the 21st Economic Forum Krynica, Poland, 7 – 8 September 2011











Impact of BIOREGIO Carpathians project

- **Realisation** of the Convention's main objective: Protection and sustainable development of the whole Carpathian region;
- Implementation of the Convention and its Protocols, especially the Biodiversity Protocol;
- Strengthen the regional network due to the involvement of different stakeholders;
- Development of recommendations for further policy action;
- Raise the local awareness on the Carpathian region and the need for sustainable development;
